About Family Camp

T his camp is open to all families and those who desire fellowship, discussion and a deeper grasp of the historic faith of the Scriptures. L imited accommodation is available to those who attend as a family in chalets and bunk-rooms. There are caravan points, or the local camping ground may be used.

T he CYC Council expects campers to attend all meetings, fully support the camp programme and happily observe Camp rules. You will be expected to assist with camp duties. There will be afternoons free for family activities.

T here is no fixed charge for the camp. Those who attend are asked to share in responsible stewardship with the costs involved. Unattached teenagers attending camp need to formally enrol, be under the direct supervision of a parent or other responsible adult at camp.


