# **Standard Operating Procedure Air Rifles**

### Location

70 Finlayson Road - refer to CYC Waihola Camp Map for further details

### **Activity Leader Requirements**

Must have current CYC Waihola Air Rifles Activity Leader training

### Ratio

1 adult to 5 children

There is a two competent adult minimum (this minimum includes the Activity Leader)

For each child that is using an air rifle there must be "immediate and hands-on" supervision for each rifle.

If there are no children present the only requirement is for a trained person to be the Activity Leader

# **Participant requirements**

Weather appropriate clothing

Must wear shoes

### **Activity Leader Instructions**

### **Activity Setup**

- Activity Leader sets up:
  - o Targets
  - o Firing and spectator lines (min. 3 metres apart)
- Rifles must stay in the case until participants arrive (unless supervised at all times).

# With Each New Group

Activity Leader gives an introductory talk covering:

- Safety Rules (see below)
- How to:
  - o Break and load the rifle
  - o Line up sights
  - Use correct stance
- How scoring works

# **Safety Rules**

- Always point the rifle in a safe direction.
- Only two participants on the firing line at once, with Leader's permission.
- After shooting:
  - o Break rifle into safe position
  - o Place it on ground
  - o Step back behind spectator line
- Spectators must stay behind spectator line.
- Explain and enforce the "stop signal" for emergencies.

# **During the Activity**

- Activity Leader monitors safety and can guide participants without distraction.
- Other adults may assist under supervision, but cannot instruct target retrieval.
- Children using rifles must be under "immediate and hands-on supervision."
- Use the "stop signal" if someone enters the firing zone. Activity resumes only when it's safe.

## **After the Activity**

- Check rifles are unloaded, return to Air Rifles Case.
- If instructor leaves, take rifles and lock up the Equipment Box.
- Targets and lines can remain if reused the same day.
- Return any other gear to the container.
- Complete the post-activity section of the Shooting (Air Rifles) Activity Sign-off Sheet.

### **Equipment**

Air Rifles Equipment Box

- Does NOT store air rifles.
- Must be taken to the activity area every time the activity runs.
- Must be locked when not in use.

### Contents:

- Activity Logbook
- Air rifle pellets (no rifles stored here)
- Pens and pencils
- Small tool kit for minor air rifle fixes
- 2 sets of rope and 2 electric fence standards for:
  - o Marking the firing line
  - o Marking the spectator line (if required)
- Easy-reset targets

### Air Rifles Case

- Only stores the air rifles (no pellets).
- Must be taken to the activity area each time.
- Must be locked when not in use.

### Reasons to end activity

If at any point the activity can no longer run safely

### **Activity Maintenance**

Paid staff inspection of the activity every 6 months to identify any new hazards/wear and tear and sign off on safety of activity. If staff deem there to be any insufficiencies that increase the risk to an unsafe level, the activity will no longer continue until the risk is remedied or eliminated.
